WHEREAS, these Minutes will be kept and once the matter involving the confidentiality of the aforementioned no longer requires that confidentiality, then the minutes can be made public.


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council may take formal action at the Special Meeting. Any action shall be taken in open session.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN OFFER OF EMPLOYMENT TO ERIC INGOGLIA
AS POLICE OFFICER IN THE BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake has conducted a hiring process for a new police officer in the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, which has included written applications, interviews, and background checks; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake has identified a candidate for offer of employment, Eric Ingoglia; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Ingoglia will complete the police academy prior to becoming a permanent officer in the Borough of Woodcliff Lake; and

WHEREAS, the appointment of Mr. Ingoglia is both subject to mental and physical examinations and the appointment may be revoked on the basis of unsuccessful completion of either examination; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that: (1) Eric Ingoglia is appointed as a probationary police officer in the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, subject to mental and physical examination; (2) Eric Ingoglia's probationary period shall conclude one year of date of hire at which time he will be become a permanent police officer; (3) upon Mr. Ingoglia's successful completion of the mental and physical examination, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake's Police Chief shall certify Eric Ingoglia for entrance into the police academy pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:1-8.1(a) and (4) the starting salary is \$35,000.00.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Request by Albrecht for legal counsel at his deposition

The Mayor stated that he received several phone calls from Wolfgang Albrecht asking for the

Borough to provide legal representation with regards to the Barbara Potash lawsuit.

Jaime Placek, responded that the Borough is not obligated to provide legal representation and normally legal representation is not necessary when you are called as a fact witness .

Councilwoman Donna Abene asked if Mr. Placek knew how long the depositions may take.

Mr. Placek could not guess at that. Mr. Albrecht's testimony "is what is" and the role of any attorney is limited. This deposition is a fact finding experience.

Councilwoman Gadaleta asked if an attorney can give advice on what to say. Mr. Placek responded that an attorney cannot speak to an individual during a deposition.

Councilwoman Gadaleta asked if it would be advisable to have an attorney give advice ahead of time.

Councilwoman Abene stated that Mr. Albrecht was an employee at the Borough when this lawsuit first came about.

The Mayor asked if we should ask Mark Madaio to see if he would be available and willing to represent Mr. Albrecht. He also asked if we should put a cap on the amount of hours to represent him.

Councilman Rendo felt that we should not put a cap on the amount of hours, but a cap on the price per hour.

Mr. Placek stated that we need to see if Mr. Madaio is listed as a fact witness in the case. If he is, then he cannot represent Mr. Albrecht.

MOTION was made by Councilwoman Abene, seconded by Councilwoman Gadaleta and unanimously approved to have our Borough Attorney draw up a Resolution to appoint an attorney to represent Wolfgang Albrecht during depositions for the Barbara Potash lawsuit.

OPEN TO PUBLIC

Motion was made by Councilwoman Gadaleta to open to the public, seconded by Councilman Belgiovine and approved unanimously.

Motion to close to the public was made by Councilwoman Gadaleta, seconded by Councilman Rendo and approved unanimously.
