MEETING MINUTES

Call to order:

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 p.m. at the Borough Hall by the President.

The minutes from October 20, 2015 were approved, as amended, on a motion from Elaine Metlitz, seconded by Dr. Sperber, and carried by roll call vote with all in favor.

County Monthly Services:

These reports were accepted on a motion from Dr. Sperber, seconded by Elaine Metlitz, and carried. It was noted that a restaurant luncheon for seniors was scheduled at the same time as the health screening, and it was suggested that future calendars be coordinated to maximize opportunities for seniors to participate in the screening.

October Sanitarian's Report:

Lisa Nassor was present at the Board of Health meeting for Linda Quinn. Lisa Nassor spoke regarding procedures to be corrected at Blue Moon and Danny's Bistro. Both establishments were issued Satisfactory upon re-inspection. Also discussed was a case of lead poisoning of a child. The park Ridge child is staying with a relative in Woodcliff Lake until abatement is complete back at home. The source of the lead was found in the paint. It was stated that houses built before 1978 could contain lead paint but has not been identified as a problem in Woodcliff Lake.

The town pool was discussed again and the sanitary inspector confirmed that there were no major health issues in 2014 or 2015, and the borough, through the Board of Health, never received any complaints from the community about the pool conditions or the snack bar.

A complaint was received from a resident about spoiled chicken from Acme and the Sanitarian meet with manager of meat department to discuss.

Panera's started renovations in November. All renovations are done during the evening hours. This is a major renovation and will be monitored by the board of health.

The October report was approved on a motion by Elaine Metlitz, seconded by Michelle Micali and carried.

October Water Report

The Coliform report was accepted on a motion from Elaine Metlitz, seconded by Michelle Micali and carried.

October Cash Receipts

The report was accepted on a motion by Elaine Metlitz seconded by Michelle Micali

Old Business

There was discussion about raising the age in the borough to 21 to purchase cigarettes. It was noted that Hillsdale had proposed increasing the age limit to 21 but has reversed that decision. It was agreed by all that taking action to make it more difficult for minors to buy tobacco products is desirable from a health viewpoint, but given the close proximity of retail stores throughout the Pascack Valley, unilateral action by any one town would not be effective. It was recommended by the Board that this discussion be brought up at a meeting of the Pascack Valley Mayors.

New Business

Rabies clinic is scheduled for Saturday, January 9, 2016. Dogs and Cats can be licensed at this time in the Borough Hall.

The meeting was adjourned on a motion from Elaine Metlitz, seconded by Michelle Micali and carried.
