

CAMP ALGONQUIN OF WOODCLIFF LAKE

Where does the name ALGONQUIN come from?

The Algonquin Native Indians were the first settlers in this bountiful area of Pascack Valley. When the Dutch East India Company settled in nearby Manhattan in the early 1600's, they exchanged glass beads and other trinkets for the coveted Indian beaver pelt. This is part of our history and we feel honored to be able to share this knowledge with our young residents. You will notice that our two camps also have Native Indian names.

What happens when it rains?

An email will be sent via community pass from the Camp Directors by 8am day of camp if:

- Camp will not be in session; Camp will be delayed; Camp will be closing early (unforeseen emergency *discretion of Camp Directors)
- When rain occurs while an outdoor session is in progress, and it appears the rain will continue, all those children at camp will be escorted by a WCL Police officer to classrooms located adjacent to Our Lady Mother of the Church. Parents are expected to have an emergency plan in place to pick up their children from both camps (half & full day) should the need arise.
- Counselors will be on hand to assist parents arriving to collect their children
 - No refunds will be given for any missed days, inclement weather days, transportation delays, dismissals from camp or within 2 weeks of start of your campers session
- Cancellations more than 30 days before your sessions start date will receive 100% refund
 - Cancellations within 15-29 days before your sessions starts will receive a 50% refund



2016 SUMMER CAMP INFORMATION

CAMP BLY

The word “BLY” means Tall and comes from the Native Indian Culture Grades 1 through 7

Camp BLY combines lots of fun activities with a friendly and informal atmosphere. Activities are varied so that campers are constantly involved in different events. Several time a week there are special events, contests, themed days and professional entertainment. Camp BLY boasts an excellent staff, consisting of young adults who are dedicated and selected for their ability in working with these age groups.

CAMP NARA

The word “NARA” means Happy and comes from the Native Indian culture. This camp is designed for those children aged 4 & 5 (must be potty trained and out of diapers).

Our littlest of campers are assigned to groups by age. Each daily session is divided into 4 periods.

A typical session will include: songs, story time, and arts & crafts. Remaining periods are filled with counselor lead games, swimming and special events.

The BLY & NARA Camp staff greets campers each morning. Arrival and attendance is taken at the Old Mill Pool entrance at 8:30am; same applies for before care at 8am. Half-Day Afternoon campers will be greeted at the main entrance to the pool at 12:30pm.

The same applies for half-day morning campers, pick up will be at the entrance to the pool at 12:30pm; the same applies for after care at 1:30pm. For the full day and half-day afternoon campers pick up will be at the Westervelt-Lydecker Playground located at 1, Oak Avenue (opposite the baseball fields *subject to change).

A staff member will remain until all children have been collected; we ask that you be prompt.
