Minutes September 20, 2016 were approved on a motion from Christine LaPaglia, seconded by Steven Sperber, and carried by a roll call vote with all in favor.

Sanitarian's Report

The Sanitarian for the board of health received a complaint about Roosters. The borough does not have an ordinance forbidding roosters. The complainant would need to file a noise complaint with the police department and follow up with the property maintenance official.

Panera Bread will begin minor renovations at its store. All renovations will take place after hours while store is closed.

The report was approved on a motion by Dr. Steven Sperber and seconded by Dr. Mary Clark and carried by a roll call vote with all in favor.

Registrar's Report

October reports were approved on a motion from Dr. Steven Sperber, seconded by Dr. Christine LaPaglia and carried by a roll call vote with all in favor.

October Water Report:

All reports regarding coliform, THM, Nitrates, HAA5, Arsenic, VOCs, Sodium, lead, copper, and disinfectant residual levels were all acceptable. All reports were approved on a motion from Dr. Steven Sperber seconded by Michelle Micali and carried.

OLD BUSINESS

The flu vaccine program will be held at the Tice Senior Center on October 20, 2016 at 11:30 to 12:30.

It was noted that the rabies clinic is scheduled for January 14, 2017. It was further noted that beginning with this year's County contract, there was no follow-up of dogs previously licensed that did not return for the vaccine and license. All residents are notified of the clinic.

Mayor Rendo intends to discuss the sale of tobacco products at the next Pascack Valley Mayors Association meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Josephine Higgins spoke about the possibility of the Borough purchasing a Drug Drop Box. The box would be a permanent fixture placed in the police department. All medicine will be accepted in the drug box. There is a possibility that grant money is available for this purchase. The board had questions about who takes medicine and if there is a fee for the service. Councilwoman Kristy Herrington will follow up on drop box. The Woodcliff Lake Board of Health supports this action for safer households.

Question was raised regarding the appropriateness of the licensing fees that were revised earlier this year and there were no changes suggested.

John Frey, President of the board of health may meet with some members of the board of health in Park Ridge to discuss joint programs with the County. A tentative date was set to discuss.
